


PERIMETER FENCE UPGRADE

The HOA is pleased to confirm that upgrading of the security perimeter fence is well underway. New extensions are being added to the fence, from the delivery gate all the way along Bear Creek Boulevard to the contractors' gate, as well as the entire perimeter of The Acres. The angled extensions, together with high-quality thermal and CCTV cameras, will add another layer of deterrence against potential intrusion.



THE ACRES HERITAGE AREA AND BIKE TRAIL

Thanks to a break in the heavy rainfall experienced recently, good progress has been made with construction of the new Acres bike trail, and we look forward to announcing the opening of this exciting facility within the next few weeks. Until then, we ask residents to please stay off the trail as the surface can very easily be damaged whilst the work is still in progress. The pictures below show the quality of the trail being built and also, unfortunately, damage caused recently by a resident riding an off-road motorbike which led to an entire section having to be re-laid.

Together with our specialist environmental service providers, HOA staff are working hard to remove any remaining litter, rubble, and invasive alien vegetation from the heritage buffer area between the Acres perimeter fence and the boundaries of residents' properties. This area is subject to a number of specific regulations in terms of the development approval due to its proximity to the Mandela House, which is a declared grade 1 heritage resource located to the south-west of The Acres, across the Schuurmansfontein Road. The aim is to eventually restore the area to a natural fynbos state, with the bike trail and the buildings across the road largely concealed by the vegetation. This process will take time, but we do expect to see considerable growth over the next cycle of the seasons.

We would also like to remind residents that dogs must always be kept on a leash in this area. There are people and machines at work and it's critical that any accidents or incidents are avoided.

MOTORBIKES AND SCOOTERS ON THE ESTATE

The HOA has noticed an increase in the number of motorbikes and scooters of various types and sizes being ridden on the Estate. Of particular concern is the fact that, in many instances, these machines are being operated by children who are well below legal driving age. These children have no driving license and have not had any formal training on the rules of the road or general road safety, which presents serious risks to all members of our community. Whilst some of these machines are electrically powered, they are still capable of reaching significant speeds; they can cause or be involved in road accidents; and cause damage to property when ridden off-road (recent examples include the golf course and various HOA common areas). For example, the popular Surron range of electric motorbikes can achieve top speeds of between 55 km/h and 110 km/h depending on the model and the mode used (which is simply a flick of a switch). Most of these bikes are designed as purely off-road machines, and have no lights, brake lights, or indicators, and are therefore not street legal. They also do not qualify as "e-bikes" as they do not have pedals and do not meet the statutory definition of "power assisted pedal cycles".

According to the National Road Traffic Act (amended in December 2024) if a vehicle has a maximum design speed of more than 45 km/h it is classified as a motor vehicle and must be registered and licensed, and ridden only by a licensed rider.

The Pearl Valley Estate Rules clearly specify the following:

- Extreme care must be taken by drivers when driving on the Estate (7.1).
- Motorized vehicles shall be driven on roads only, and only by persons who hold valid current drivers' licenses (7.1).

• No unlicensed motorbikes or quad bikes may be driven on the Estate roads (7.7).

The Estate Rules Transgression Chart includes penalties for reckless driving (R1,000) driving off-road (R500) driving without a valid license (R1,000) and damage to property (R5,000).

The HOA's primary concern is the safety of all road users and members of our community. We appeal to residents to ensure compliance by all family members and guests. We strongly recommend that children should wear a helmet, even when riding stand-up scooters, and that any bicycle or scooter used at night should be fitted with a forward facing light and rear reflectors.
